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NOTE FROM THE GM AL VALLECORSA

Dear Members,

I am excited to meet all of you and make it a wonderful season. In saying that, there are many things that need to be taken care of as it relates to the upcoming 2026 season. One of which is having some pool plaster work done in the pool and then filling it with water! The date for opening the pool is still TBD based on this. We also are looking to fill some key positions in marketing, pool aquatics, lifeguards and a swim coach.

What can you expect from me and what is important? 1. To continue with the great traditions of the club and maybe sprinkle in some new ones as we go along. 2. Be a huge support to the great team we have here at LFCC: Maddie, Adam, Tim, Paul, Matt, Chef Miguel, Stephanie, and Julian (Mr. Mixologist) who all do such a wonderful job for all of you and are truly great individuals! 3. Show fiscal responsibility \$\$\$. And 4. Continue to build on what we are and make cosmetic and operational improvements as we can. We always love to hear what comes out of from the annual survey as well as comments made throughout the year and you are always welcome to come in and say hello!

I do want to mention, (and you may have already seen some recent club emails go out) about club rules, policies and safety. One of the things that has come up since my start date from “multiple members” is “more departmental enforcement of club rules and policies”. The rules are in place for everyone’s safety so if you have any questions about the rules, policies or just have safety questions you can always come in or ask a manager. One rule to mention is no walking, dogs, jogging, or riding bicycles on the golf course or paths is not allowed and we will be looking at updating our signage at these point of entries to the course.

On the financial front we are off to a good start to 2026 and as a reminder the monthly financials are always posted on the web portal:

-YTD Total Revenue of \$1,091,069 are 4% better than budget \$1,047,843 and 4.8% better YoY \$1,039,066

-COGS are higher YTD of \$9,839 to the budget which is line with the higher revenue number

-YTD Total Payroll of \$517,817 to budget of \$560,315 is 7.6% better than budget

-YTD Expenses of \$990,820 are 3.7% better than budget of \$1,028,064

Some Capital expenditure items to mention for this year: Some Kitchen Equipment Repair/Replacement, for Golf Water Station, Scoreboard, Range Improvements, Banquet equipment/Bus station/Coolers, Bridge Repair work, investigate for a lightning detection system, some tree work and fountains out on the golf course, pool plastering, and HVAC replacement.

These are just a few things that I wanted to highlight. I can’t wait to work with your Board of Directors and all the committees, and I hope you enjoy the golf course, pool, food and beverage, planned golf events, and the camaraderie of each other. I look forward to meeting all of you soon.

NOTE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

It is nice to see golfers on the course taking advantage of the unseasonably warm weather.

A big thank you to LFCC member *Rick Steward* who provided the leadership on the bridge work at holes #3 and #9. Grounds Maintenance staff helped with some of the "grunt work". The bridge decking should last decades.

Carryover from last season:

Meteorologists still consider central IL to be in a drought. Some of our rough areas that are out of the reach of irrigation really suffered during last season's droughty conditions. The grass in these areas is thin and, in some cases, bare soil is visible. I hope spring conditions allow for some recovery of this grass. Be patient as we combat the emerging weeds in these areas.

In attending educational meetings this winter, I learned that we did many things correctly last season, such as reducing the use of growth regulators. Purdue University Extension Agronomist *Dr. Lee Miller* told us that in 2025 he had more requests to diagnose problems on golf courses than he had in the 3 previous seasons combined. High night temperatures and very few breaks from oppressive heat led to problems with grass that we were not used to experiencing. Let's hope for more favorable conditions in 2026!

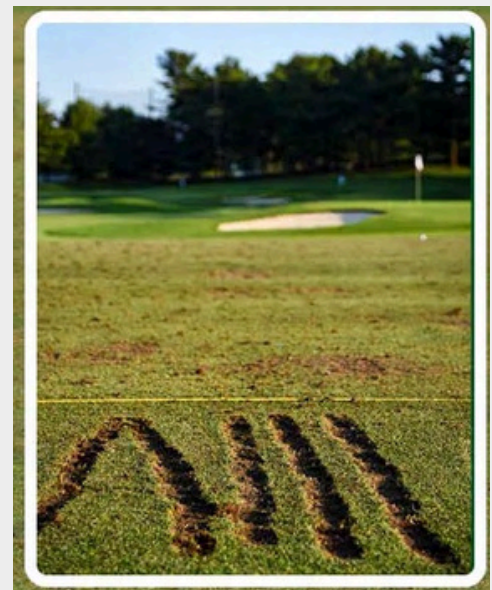
Spring:

As I write this on 03-25-26, we have mowed greens 5 times! We have rolled greens, tees, and fairways. We have mowed fairways and tees at least once. We are about 3-4 weeks ahead of last year. In March of 2025, the average low temperature was 20° F and we had only 4 days that reached 70° F or above. Our chemical applications started earlier this year.

As we open the use of the natural grass on the practice range, we remind everyone of the proper divot pattern that favors grass recovery.

Please remember to repair ball marks on the green and use the provided sand to fill divots on tees and fairways.

NOTE FROM THE GOLF SHOP

Spring has arrived at LFCC, and the season is off to a strong start with over 550 rounds played in March. We would like to remind all members that you must check in with the Golf Shop prior to beginning your round.

In-season guest fees will be in effect from May 1st through September 30th. Please also help us maintain a safe and enjoyable course environment by notifying the Golf Shop of any walkers, joggers, or bicyclists on the course, as this is not permitted.

We ask that all members adhere to the club's House and Ground Rules, including policies regarding course etiquette, guests, carts, and dress code. If you would like a copy of these rules, please contact the Golf Shop. Additionally, be sure to review the course and cart rules posted outside the Golf Shop before play.

New this year is the Battle of I-57, a season-long points competition. Players will earn points through participation in events throughout the year, with the top 24 qualifiers advancing to a Ryder Cup-style event in October.

We're also introducing the Gold Tees, a new forward tee option designed for juniors, beginners, and anyone looking for a shorter, more relaxed round. These tees will be available for 9 holes on Wednesdays prior to league play and for 18 holes on weekends. Please note that Gold Tee rounds are not postable scores with the CDGA.

Be sure to register for upcoming leagues and events through Golf Genius. Registration must be completed via a web browser using GGID: LFCC1976, which will direct you to the club's registration page. Early season events include the Spring Fling, Horse Race, Spring Showcase, Players Cup, Captains Draft, and our first major events of the year, The Duo and The Slipper. Be sure to check weekly emails for full event details and reminders.

We're excited to welcome everyone back for another great season at LFCC. It's shaping up to be a fantastic year on the course. As always, we appreciate your cooperation in following club policies and helping us provide the best possible experience for all members and guests. 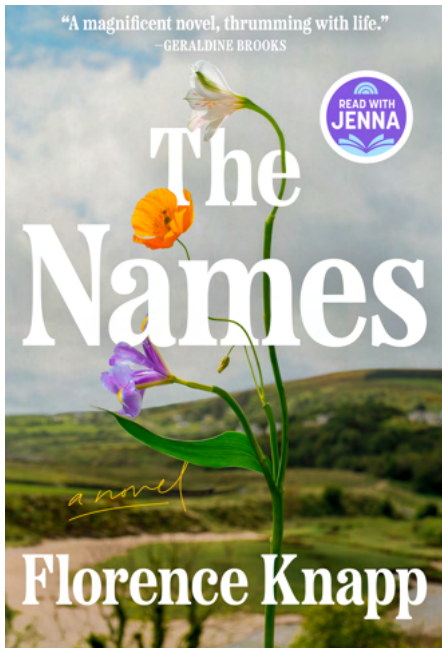

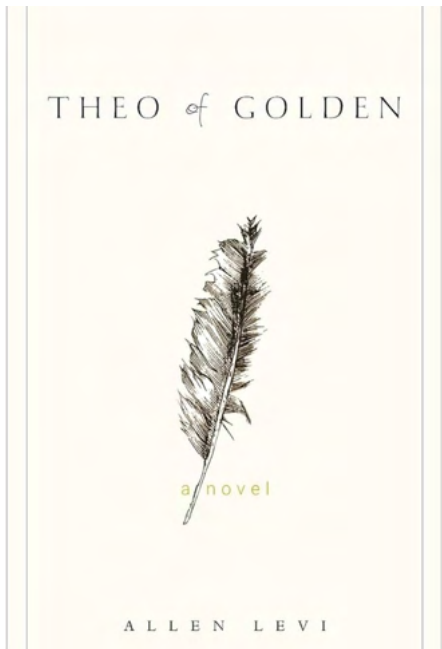


Book: The Names Tuesday, April 21st

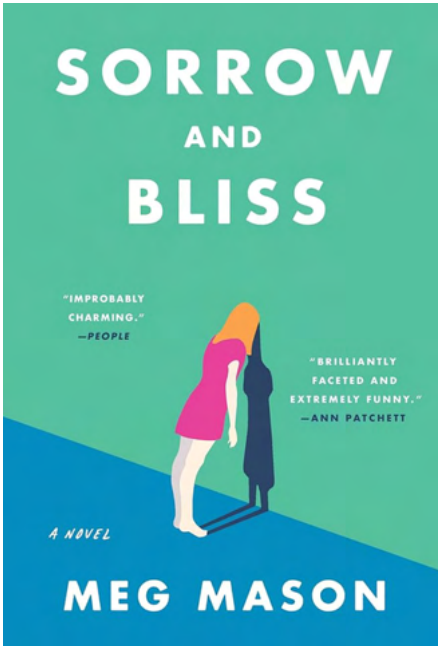

Theo visits the local coffeehouse, where ninety-two pencil portraits hang on the walls, portraits of the people of Golden done by a local artist. He begins purchasing them, one at a time, and putting them back in the hands of their 'rightful owners.' With each exchange, a story is told, a friendship born, and a life altered. *Theo of Golden* is a beautifully crafted novel about the power of creative generosity, the importance of wonder to a purposeful life, and the invisible threads of kindness that bind us to one another.”

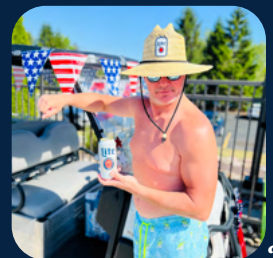
