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NOTE FROM THE GM AL VALLECORSA

Dear Members,

As I complete my first four months as General Manager, I want to share how much I have enjoyed getting to know our members, team, and the many facets that make Lincolnshire such a special place. During this time, I have had the opportunity to meet many wonderful members, learn the rhythm of the Club, and gain a deeper appreciation for the traditions, activities, and sense of community that make Lincolnshire unique.

One thing that has impressed me most is the variety of opportunities available for members of all ages to engage and participate. I have enjoyed attending many of our signature events, including the Mother's Day Brunch, the Captain's Draft Golf Event, and the Memorial Day BBQ. It has also been a pleasure to watch Junior golf and tennis players improve and our Stingrays swim team; their dedication and effort have been outstanding. I was also fortunate to be here for the opening of both the pool and Stingrays season, which marked the start of another exciting summer at the Club. As we move through the busy pool season, our goal remains to provide a safe, enjoyable, and comfortable experience for all members. During periods of hot weather, we work to maintain the pool temperature at a level that is both refreshing and comfortable. To help us properly schedule lifeguards and staff, manage labor effectively, and deliver the level of service our members expect, we continue to encourage pool reservations through WAAG (Week at a Glance), which become available each Monday. While participation in the reservation process has been lower than anticipated (about 18%), our team has remained flexible and committed to meeting members' needs. I am pleased to say that many members have complimented the staff on the service they have received, and I appreciate the team's dedication and hard work throughout the season.

In the last newsletter, I mentioned 4 key areas of success: continue the club's great traditions, be a strong supporter of the great team we have here at LFCC, show fiscal responsibility, and continue building on who we are and make cosmetic and operational improvements as we can. I believe we are on that path! We have added some new photos down at Stingrays and information boards at the tennis area and pool. More to come on those... We have also moved to a quarterly survey, and I would really encourage everyone to share their feedback so we can continue to improve where we can. I would also like to congratulate Stacie Guido, on picking the "King of Clubs". This was many weeks where the card was not picked until it was selected about a week ago. We will pick a new King of Clubs in a few more weeks on Thursday nights at 6:00pm. The parking lot was also striped. As a reminder, please follow the arrows and go in the correct direction. A new yellow curb was installed near the practice area to assist emergency vehicles should they ever need to come in, and to ensure trash pickup will not skip us. You can always drop off your clubs there and then park. In the clubhouse, we did all our yearly inspections and tags for fire and AED equipment.

NOTE FROM THE GM CONTINUED

Many of you may have noticed the large rock by the pumphouse on hole number 13. If you haven't had the chance to read the plaque, it pays tribute to Joe Hallbeck, his love of golf and LFCC, and his efforts to help with irrigation on the entire golf course. Being our 50th, we would like to thank Dave Wright and Feutz Contractors for their very generous contribution to help facilitate that project. I would also like to thank our golf course superintendent, Paul Sermersheim, for keeping the golf course in such fine shape. I would also like to wish Adam Shallenberger all the best as he moves on from LFCC after many years of service to the club. As we are looking for a new Food and Beverage manager, Peter Kovac will be the interim manager. And here for a few months. He is an Illinois native, the youngest of seven, and is engaged to be married this September 19th at the Long Island Aquarium. Peter has been in the food and beverage business at country clubs for the past 27 years.

I recently read an email from the grounds committee on cart etiquette. By observing these simple principles, they affect your course, and I would urge everyone to look at that email if you happened to miss it.

On the financial front we are still in a good spot for 2026 and as a reminder the monthly financials are always posted on the web portal:

-YTD Total Revenue of \$2,187,820 are 2.9% better than budget \$2,124,572 and 6.6% better YoY \$2,045,556

-COGS are higher YTD of \$7,232 to the budget but (lower from last month) which is line with the higher revenue number

-YTD Total Payroll of \$1,025,989 to budget of \$1,124,835 is 8.8% better than budget

-YTD Expenses of \$2,027,903 are 4.8% better than budget of \$2,128,805

Some Capital expenditure items to mention for this year: The Board of Directors has approved a new Lightning Detection system (Thorguard). Our old system has passed its life expectancy and is not working. We hope to get Thorguard installed sometime in late August, if not sooner. Currently, all golf course/range, pickleball, and tennis play will be at your own risk. As well as swim at your own risk at the pool. Staff will do their best to communicate inclement weather, and members should seek shelter if asked.

For those of you who signed up for this year's Member Guest, I hope you have a great time July 16th-18th. The club has also planned a Legacy Dining Event for our honorary members, scheduled for September 10th, with invites to follow soon. We also have some fun things planned for September to celebrate the club's 50th anniversary. More to come out on that soon. Everyone, I hope you all have a great 4th of July, and please stay safe. The club will have our BBQ poolside on the 4th, and the hours of operation for that weekend will be announced soon. The BBQ is 11:30-3:30!

These are just a few things that I wanted to highlight. The Board of Directors has been very supportive as have all the committees, and I hope you enjoy the golf course, pool, tennis, food and beverage, planned events, and the camaraderie of each other. I look forward to seeing you all soon.

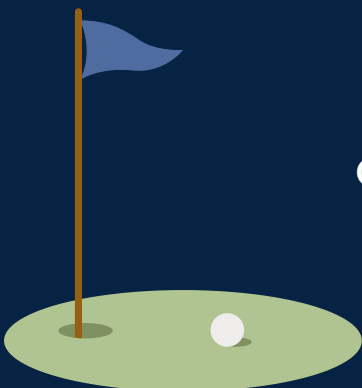

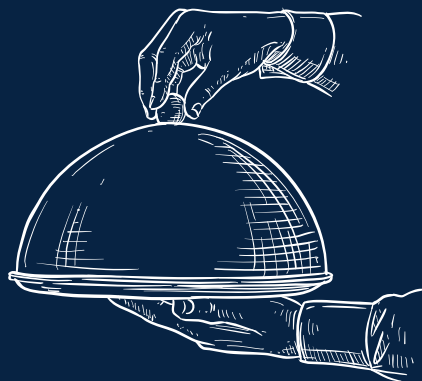

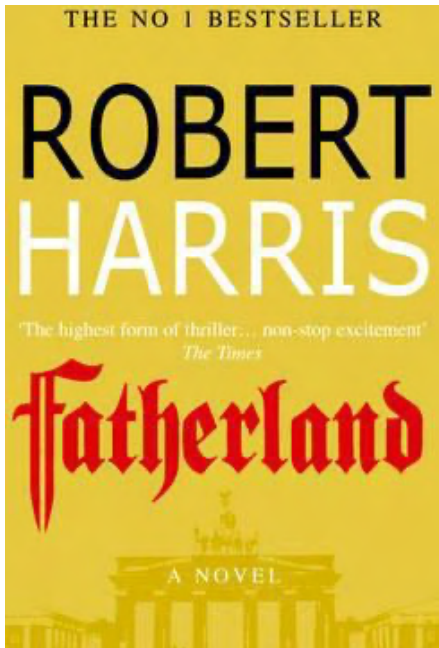


Book: Fatherland

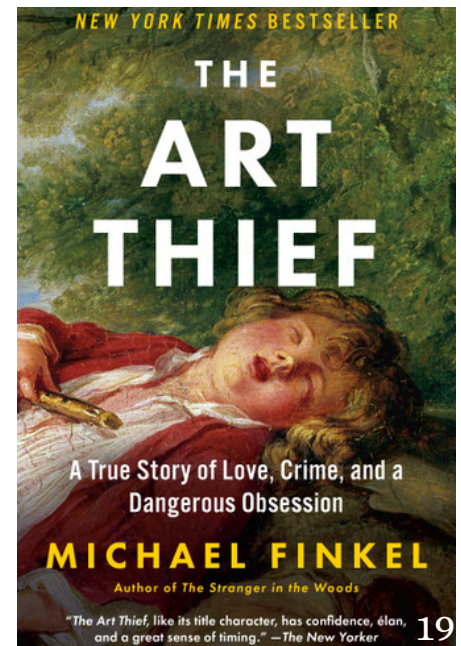
Book: The Art Thief

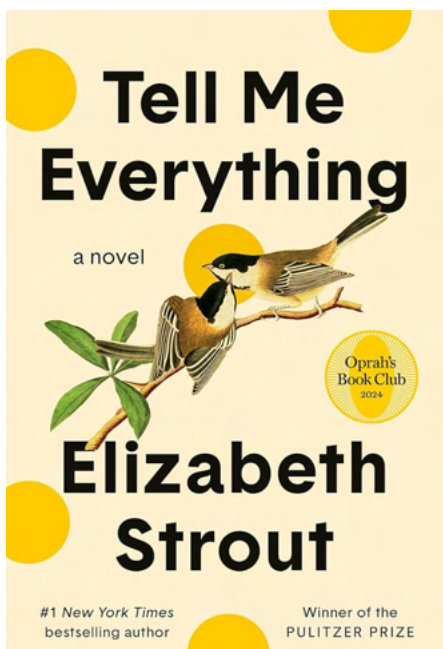

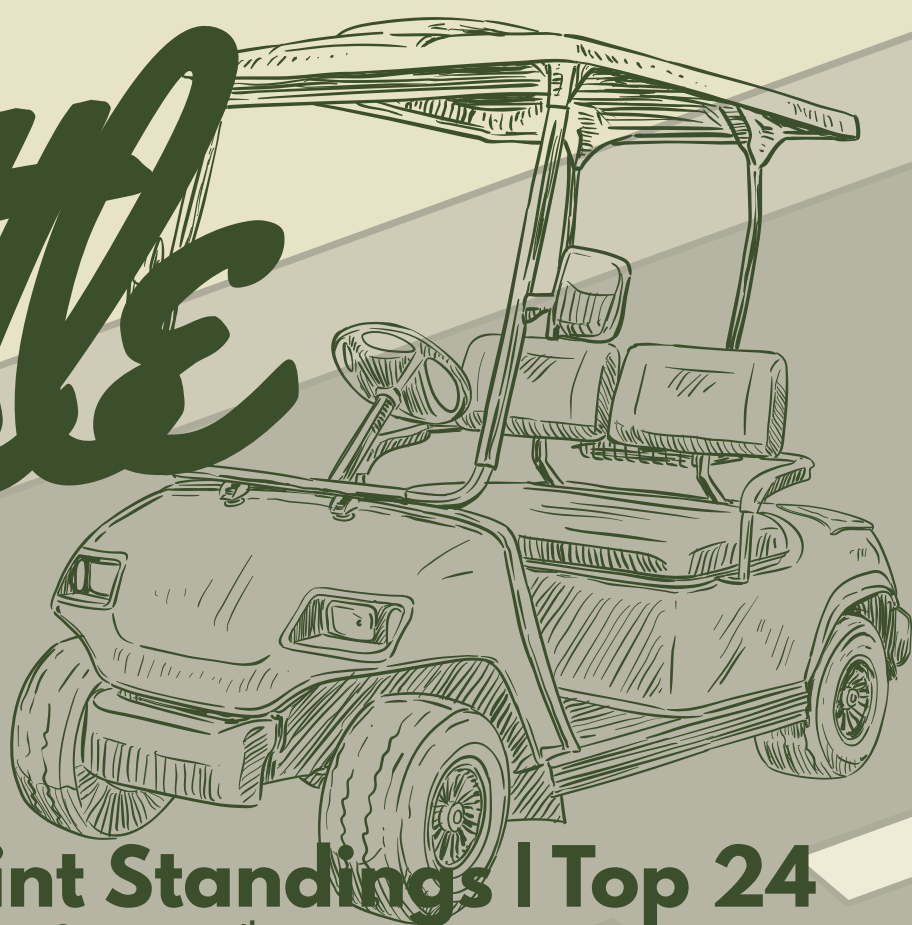
